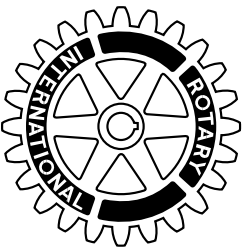

Next Thursday night, the Marion Rotary Club will sponsor the fourth in a series of Travelogues at the Marion High School Auditorium starting at 7:00pm. Gray Warriner will present an excellent presentation on the Lewis & Clark expedition of the Louisiana Purchase. President Thomas Jefferson purchased the land from France & Napoleon Bonaparte in 1803 which doubled the size of the United States. The price was \$15,000,000 for 529,280,00 acres, about 3 cents per acre - a fantastic bargain! But no one knew anything about the land. President Jefferson commissioned Meriwether Lewis (1774-1809) and William Clark (1770-1838) in 1804 to form an expedition to map and document the trails, rivers, and other features in this previously unexplored territory. Mr. Warriner will narrate a beautiful movie presentation of the trail Lewis & Clark blazed through the wilderness.
