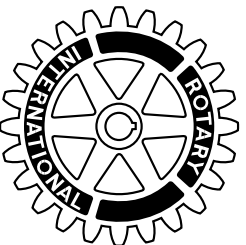

RI Centennial News

Rotarians have contributed funds and mobilized by the hundreds of thousands to ensure that children are immunized. Since the PolioPlus program's inception in 1985, more than two billion children have received oral polio vaccine. To date, 209 countries, territories, and areas around the world are polio-free. As of June 2003, Rotary has committed more than \$500 million to global polio eradication. 2002-03 expenditures: \$36.9 million
